

Prerequisites

The programme is open for persons with a **completed** Bachelor's degree or the equivalent (at least 180 higher education credits) in any academic or artistic training, **or** with relevant professional experience, as well as skills in English to the equivalent of English B course (Swedish secondary education system). Unless English is native language, international students are required to prove English skills by a proficiency test. For a list of approved test bodies and required results, please see link below.

For applicants without a university degree, the general qualifications for studies at Swedish universities are to be fulfilled. Applicants without a university education need to submit in the application a certificate of complete upper secondary education, documented by diploma or mark sheets.

Selection principles

Students will be recruited on the basis of academic or professional merits, interview and submitted text sample. A first selection of applicants will be made on the basis of the written applications. Approx. 20 applicants will be called upon for an interview, after which the second and final selection of students will take place. Approx. 7-9 students will be accepted.

From 2011, students from countries outside the EU/EEA and Switzerland will be required to pay an application fee as well as tuition fees. 1. **An introductory letter**, in which you describe your motives for applying to the programme and e.g. which your particular areas of interest are, future career plans etc.
2. **A Curriculum Vitae**
Where your name, date of birth, home address, E-MAIL ADDRESS and telephone number are listed together with an account of previous studies, work experience and other relevant engagements.
3. **A list of published texts and/or exhibitions, artworks**, or similar projects (if applicable) that you have realised or been engaged in.
4. **An exhibition-related text**. This text sample of a maximum of 2-3 pages could be written either specifically for the application, **or** be previously published. **The format is optional for the applicant but could e.g be a short essay, a review or an article dealing with a topic within the field of art-/culture-/exhibitions**
